Sixth New Hampshire Volunteer Infantry, Co. E Historical Association Annual Meeting

Our Annual meeting was held on Sunday January 28th. The current slate of Association officers were re-nominated to their current positions. There were two exceptions: Membership Chair and Trustee for 3-year term.

John Panetta is due to be a father very soon (congratulations!) and the demands of fatherhood and family are difficult to juggle with the pace of trying to handle all of our potential members. Roger Joly was duly nominated to the position for his years of excellent service to the Sixth. All at the meeting feel that Roger will do a great job in talking to our possible recruits and discussing our hobby as a whole.

Our bylaws require a separate vote on the open Trustee position. Jeremy Robinson was re-nominated to keep his seat as a Trustee for a further three year term.

One of the items on our agenda this year was our company insurance policy. We are currently covered by three policies: Our own, NR, and NEB. Matty Cronin went over how the NR policy applies to us for events we go to or hold. He also discussed the NEB's insurance policy. After some discussion, it was decided to maintain our policy through the renewal of October 2018.

A long-time former member of the Sixth has offered to us his gear. A discussion was held as to whether we should purchase all of the gear, or some. Matty and Rob Tarbox stated that if we can get a good deal on the gear we should go for it. We may turn around and sell to a new member what we have extras of.

We discussed our schedule of events and decided on which National Regiment and New England Brigade events to add to our own schedule. There was a discussion about needing to support both organizations. Reenacting can survive, but we must support our local events as well as national mega events.

In 2017 we changed how we did our event registrations to all walk-on/individual registrations. Given the needs of event coordinators, for 2018 we are going to go back to sending in unit registrations. In order for this to be successful, Matty Cronin reiterated how important it is for EVERYONE to get back to him about attending an event, whether you will be attending or not. He asks that everyone do a "Reply All" on emails for their attendance for an event.

Chris Blodgett brought forward an idea to help boost member turnout for events that we have two "Unit Sponsored" events. Two events (one NR and one NEB) would be selected and the unit would cover the cost of registration. This will hopefully help us show numbers for events by removing a small piece of financial burden on the registration side, and will also give the event organizers enough information on numbers attending.

The two Unit Sponsored events for this year are Burkittsville and Borderlands.

At the conclusion of our regular business, Scott Sleeper brought up the fact he has been in the hobby for over 20+ years now. He believes that it is time for the unit to start grooming another officer to be available for events that he is unable to attend, and for future leadership in the field. There was quick discussion about either of our two current sergeants stepping into that role. Both declined. Scott put forward Chris Blodgett to be commissioned as a

Second Lieutenant and to start working with him during our drill and some events Chris will continue in his primary role as Corporal for certain events and bring his officer gear with him.

Matty Cronin stated that with Chris moving up the chain of command, there will be a need to fill a Corporal position. We currently have four. Matty nominated Bob Moncada to begin training for that role. Chris will work with Bob to learn his new position over the year.

Event Registration & Unit Sponsored Events

Burkittsville (NR) and Borderlands (NEB)

We are resuming unit registration (at least for NEB) for events to give coordinators the anticipated numbers so they can plan accordingly. Matty will send out an email for an event asking for those who can and cannot make the called for event. He asks that EVERYONE does a 'Reply All', even if not going, so we have a good idea of who is going and possible rides for other members. The unit will send our registration in as a whole. Once you arrive at an event, you will need to reimburse the unit at the event site.

In an effort to increase numbers for two MAX EFFORT events (one NR and one NEB) the unit decided to create 'Unit Sponsored Events.' These are events where if you register through our usual process, the unit will cover the registration fee and you do not need to reimburse the unit! If you sign up for a Unit Sponsored Event and do not show, you will be responsible for reimbursing the unit, unless a mitigating circumstance prevented you for going (family emergency, illness, etc.).

Burkittsville (NR) - For those who have already sent in your registration, and do go to the event, you will be reimbursed by the unit.

Borderlands (NEB) – Call will go out for numbers on this at some point.
